Programme Updates

Cohort 1 Output 2 declarations	We are pleased to share that Output 2 retention declarations were made for a total of 913 participants (very nearly the entire cohort). A big thank you to all of you for working with your participants to promote engagement during this output review window. The DfE will be in a position to audit and verify the declaration data in mid-July. Therefore, we anticipate that we will be able to share invoices with delivery partners w/c 25 July. We understand that many delivery partners will not be in a position to process invoices over the school summer holidays and therefore recognise that we may receive invoices at the beginning of the new academic year. We apologise that these will be shared later than the date previously communicated in the Engagement & Participation Guidance document as a result of DfE timelines for review.
NPQLTD eligibility	The DfE have shared that lead mentors for providers accredited to deliver Initial Teacher Training (ITT) from 2024 are becoming eligible for scholarships to access NPQs in Leading Teacher Development (NPQLTD). This will apply for participants from the February 2023 NPQ cohort. The role of lead mentor is a new requirement for all providers delivering ITT leading to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) from September 2024 and includes: oversight, supervision and quality assurance of other mentors; design and delivery of training for other mentors; close working with trainees during intensive training and practice and the design of such elements; and oversight of trainee progress throughout the year and identification of interventions or modifications where required. The evidence-based content set out in the NPQLTD on the design and delivery of professional development is of central relevance to the lead mentor role. The ITT accreditation process is due to conclude in October 2022, after which successful providers will be announced.
